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Services

Breakfast/Lunch

Students may eat breakfast/lunch at school at no charge. Food is not allowed to be taken from the cafeteria without prior approval from the Kitchen Manager. During lunch, a sharing box is available for $3^{\rm rd}$ - $6^{\rm th}$ grade students; however, students are required to dispose of any uneaten food and trash before leaving the cafeteria. Breakfast is served from 7:55-8:10. Students may bring their own lunch to school and may purchase milk for \$0.25.

Classroom Parties/Snacks

Due to the rigors of the instructional standards, parties will occur 3 times per year. Parents wishing to acknowledge their child's birthday are encouraged to donate a book to the library in honor of their child. Any celebrations will be limited to the last 5 minutes of class. Snacks are allowed at school under the following guidelines:

- They must be healthy, i.e. fruit, vegies, water, yogurt, etc.
 No gum, candy, soda or chips
- Containers, wrappers, papers, bottles must be recycled or thrown away
- Snacks may only be eaten during morning recess in the designated area under the tree near the play structure

Extended Day Program

Extended Day Enrichment Program operates M-F from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Please see Christine Silva or Dorena McDaniel in the front office if you are interested in having your child participate.

Personal Responsibility

Beginning each quarter, 1st – 6th grade students will be given five (5) Personal Responsibility (PR) points. If they show personal responsibility and keep at least one PR point for the nine-week period, they will be awarded with a PR activity at the end of the quarter. A loss of a PR point will result in after school reflection time for 20 minutes. Students do not have to serve the same day but will remain on a no privilege list until reflection time is served. Loss of all 5 points in a quarter, will eliminate them from participation in the activity. The PR program will follow our guidelines for student behavior.

Student Behavior

Student behavior expectations are set to support our mission of student achievement and school safety.

School Rules:

Attendance

Policies

Notification Regarding Expulsion

The Fresno Unified Board of Education has established policies and standards of behavior which promote learning and protect the safety and well-being of students. When these policies are violated, it may be necessary to suspend or expel a student. The following offenses will warrant a mandatory referral for expulsion:

- Possessing loaded or unloaded firearms
- Brandishing a knife at another person
- Unlawfully selling a controlled substance
- Sexual assault (including attempt) or sexual battery
- Possessing an explosive

For all other violations, the principal shall have the discretion to recommend expulsion of a student. A notification seeking parental understanding of the policy will be sent home the first week of school.

Grades and Homework

Pre-School through First Grade - Students are given progress indicators based on growth in Language Arts, Mathematics, and Social Skills.

Second through Sixth Grade – Grades will be determined through a variety of assignments and/or assessments based on grade level standards. **Students who are achieving below grade level will receive a grade not higher than a D**. This means some students will receive D's on their report cards even though they are doing their best. In order to earn an A, B, or C, students must be achieving at, or above, grade level and doing A, B, or C quality work. Students at any level in any academic area can receive a lower grade than their ability level if their assignments are of poor quality or are incomplete.

Homework – Homework is an important part of the school day. It may be assigned by teachers to provide further practice of the lessons being taught in class. To ensure quality completion of homework:

Teachers will:

- 1. Assign homework Monday Thursday (amounts vary)
- 2. Check homework when it is returned
- 3. Maintain a record of homework returned

Students will:

- 1. Bring homework home
- 2. Do the assignments
- 3. Return completed homework assignments when they are due

Parents will:

- 1. Provide a quiet place for students to work
- 2. Encourage and assist when possible or necessary
- 3. Review the completed assignments/check ATLAS regularly

Possible Consequences:

- 1. Loss of recess to complete assignments
- 2. Grades affected by missed assignments
- 3. Parent contact/conference

Promotion/Retention

Students will be identified at the end of the first quarter if they are "At Risk of Retention". Parents will be informed at the Parent Teacher Conference held in October. At that time, you and your child's teacher will discuss and plan interventions that will assist in your child meeting grade level requirements. A final determination whether to promote or retain will be made during the fourth quarter of school. Students who are being considered for retention will have a Student Success Team meeting to determine placement and further intervention strategies. Promotion is considered utilizing multiple measures including the social emotional well-being of the child.
